

Noun declension:

Does this language have a case or class system?

In this language, size and/or other attribute comparisons are made with a special noun inflection. The exact workings of this inflection has not been specified.

Possible uses:

My dog is bigger than a bread box. My dog is more bread-box_{SIZE}

My dog is faster than a panda. My dog is more panda_{SPEED}

My dog is more like a cat than most cats My dog is more $cat_{SIMILARITY}$

My house is bigger than your planet My house is big your planet_{COMPARE} (does this mean more big or less big?)

generally: My x is more $noun_{ADJ}$ My x is adj $noun_{MORE}$
