


















HOW TO UDANO MOR

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Speak Udano Mor

The pidgin should be used unless special technical support is required or you need to talk about the rules of the game itself.



Complete goals

New players may receive in-game goals to complete that they must learn from other players by asking them what their goal is



Ask questions

Did someone say something you don't understand? Ask what it means in pidgin! No matter how small, everyone is happy to answer questions— it's part of the game!



Make up new words

If you don't know the word for something, you should invent a new word for it, even if you think a word exists already! New words should not be based on existing languages.



Avoid perscriptivism

Don't be a grammar/spelling nazi! Udano Mor is an always evolving language, so there's no right or wrong way to speak or write Udano Mor!
